- identify some of the societies, cultures and religions of the past
- use documents, printed sources, the internet, databases, pictures, photos, music, artefacts, historic buildings and visits to collect information about the past.
- ask and answer a range of questions about the past
- know and begin understand significant aspects of the history within the wider world
- identify different sources and evaluate their effectiveness and historical knowledge
- explain an event using simple form of classification, eg. to do with money or religion, long term and short term effects
- answer questions that are structured and provide supporting evidence for statements made
- be able to see two sides of a question and can offer arguments on both sides
