READING

We will be looking at 'People who help us' and the roles they play in society.

The children will be learning the stories to support their language development, role play, sequencing and retelling of the story. We will be learning songs to help us remember the stories.

We will begin to learn Phase 3 letter sounds and continue to practise segmenting and blending CVC words using Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds such as: ch-o-p, f-i-sh, p-i-g, r-ai-n, s-o-ck, d-o-g, r-e-d, c-oa-t, r-igh-t, etc...

How to help at home

Read a daily bedtime story with your child. Use 'reading eggs' regularly.

Discuss different people who help us such as doctors, dentists, post people, fire fighters, police etc and talk about how their job is important and how they help people. Visit your local library and look at information books about different people who help us in society.

Practise reading CVC words and search on you-tube for 'segmenting and blending Phase 3 sound videos' support and encourage your child to join in with reading the words. Please support your child to read their book daily and make sure that you sign their reading record. Reading folders need to be in your child's book bag every day please.

WRITING

The children will be learning to hear, say and record sounds in words and will be continuing to practise their segmenting and blending skills.

We will be learning to record sounds in sequence using an alphabet match as support.

We will be learning to write simple sentences remembering a capital letter at the beginning, fingers spaces, a full stop at the end and making sure that all our letters are sitting on the line.

We will be writing letters, people who help us speech bubbles, labelling people who help us and writing sentences about people who help us.

We will be working on correct letter formation and practising out letter formation using our Nelson handwriting book.

We will be continually going over our Phase 2 Phonic sounds and tricky words and we will be learning Phase 3 digraphs, trigraphs and tricky words.

How to help at home

Encourage your child to write words using the sounds we have been learning. When you are out encourage your child to look for letters in the environment and talk about the **sounds** those letters make.

Practise the letter sounds with your child daily and having a go at writing the letters words and sentences.

Continue to support your child to use their Nelson handwriting book and support their letter formation – book 2.

Please continue to support your child's physical development by going on regular visits to the park to encourage large movements such as: climbing, swinging, jumping, running. Please also support your child's small movements through colouring, lego play, cooking, drawing, threading, playdough etc.
