## What we will be





READING	How to help at home
<ul> <li>read a range of fiction and non-fiction texts.</li> <li>They will continue to apply phonic knowledge and skills to decode words as well as continue to learn strategies to help learn new spelling patterns.</li> <li>They will embed their understanding of digraphs and trigraphs to support reading more complex words.</li> <li>They will practise using prediction and inference skills when talking about texts.</li> <li>They will learn to support their ideas and responses using evidence found in the text.</li> <li>Pupils will continue to develop pleasure in reading</li> </ul>	Please listen to your child read daily and sign their reading record book.  Ensure your child regularly logs in to Reading Eggs at home.  Ask your child to retell what has happened in their books so far and to predict what might happen next.
WRITING	How to help at home
<ul> <li>Children will learn to</li> <li>write simple, coherent narratives about personal experiences and those of others (real or fictional)</li> <li>write about real events</li> <li>demarcate most sentences in their writing with capital letters and full stops, and use question marks correctly when required</li> <li>use present and past tense</li> <li>use co-ordination (e.g. or / and / but) and some subordination (e.g. when / if / that / because) to join clauses</li> <li>Develop careful handwriting formation</li> </ul>	Encourage children to keep a diary, practising writing about real events in the past tense  Handwriting practise
MATHEMATICS	How to help at home
