I would like to start by saying how proud we are of all your children and how well they have settled into school this half term.

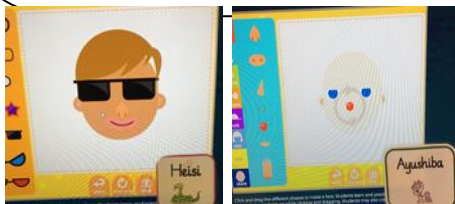
Welcome to the Camrose Family ☺

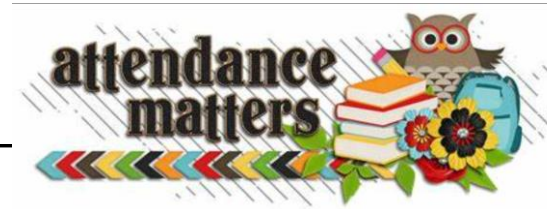


Congratulations to you all – keep it up, let's hope that we have even more children next half term! ☺

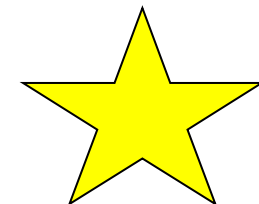
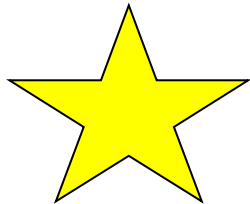
