Disadvantaged pupils make slightly less progress than their peers. They are below National expectations (APS: 28) in all subjects but not significantly.

The majority of PP spending (70%) was spent within EYFS and KS1. This has resulted in the gap being narrowed considerably between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils. As a result, by the end of KS1, disadvantaged pupils are working in line with, or above, their peers in all subjects.

There continues to be a gap at the end of KS2 between disadvantaged and other pupils.
