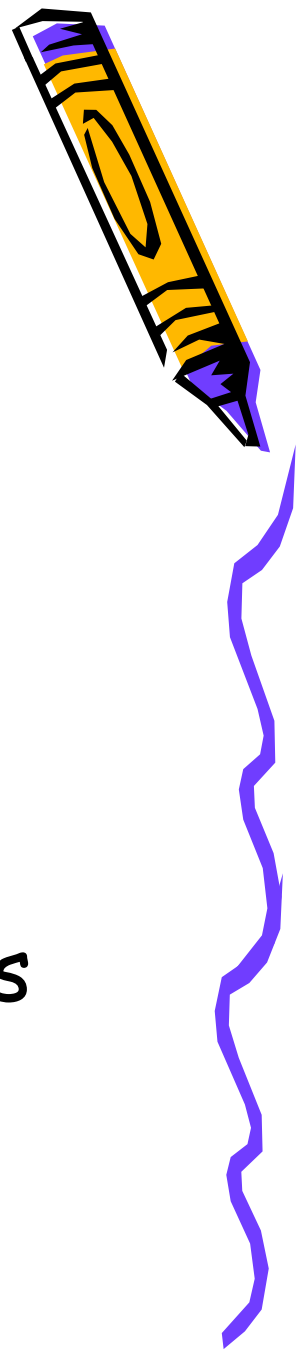

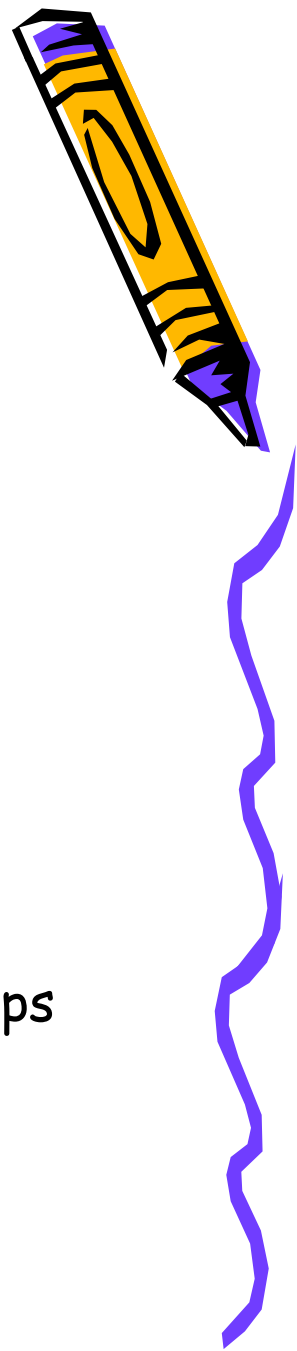

Please support your child to be independent when using the toilet.

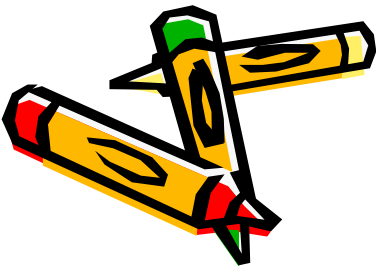
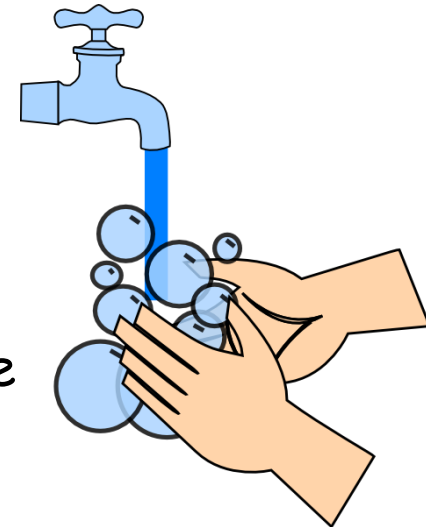


Please support your child to be independent with dressing and undressing. Encourage them to put on their own coat and do up the zips and buttons. Velcro fastenings on shoes please.

seconds is the recommended guidance sing the **happy birthday song** twice with your child.



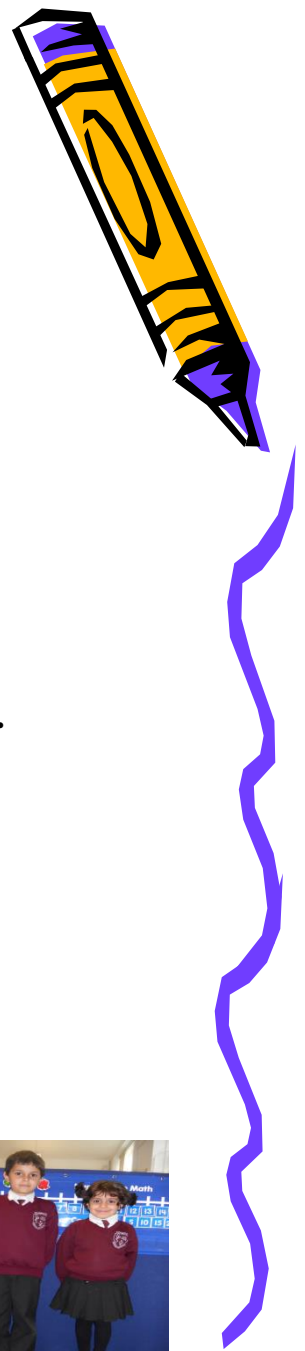
Uniform

All items in **bold** have to be purchased from the Teenywear uniform shop (see Teenywear leaflet) all other items can be brought from any high street shop.

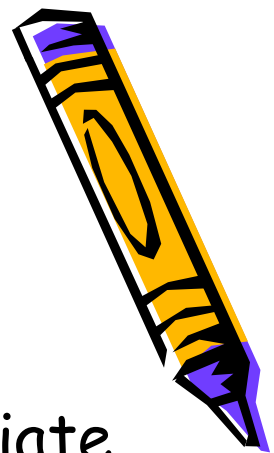
Every item of uniform **MUST** be clearly named.

Things your child will need for school



- Full Nursery uniform (named).
- Velcro fastening shoes would be most appropriate as many children cannot do up their own laces.
- Please label your child's belongings and ensure your children can recognise their own name on their uniform including their coats!
- Book bags need to come to school EVERYDAY
- A named water bottle replaced daily
- On rainy days can you please bring in a raincoat as children play outside in all weathers.
- Sunny days children need suncream



No snacks are allowed in school, your child will be provided with a daily piece of fruit for snack.



Keyworkers



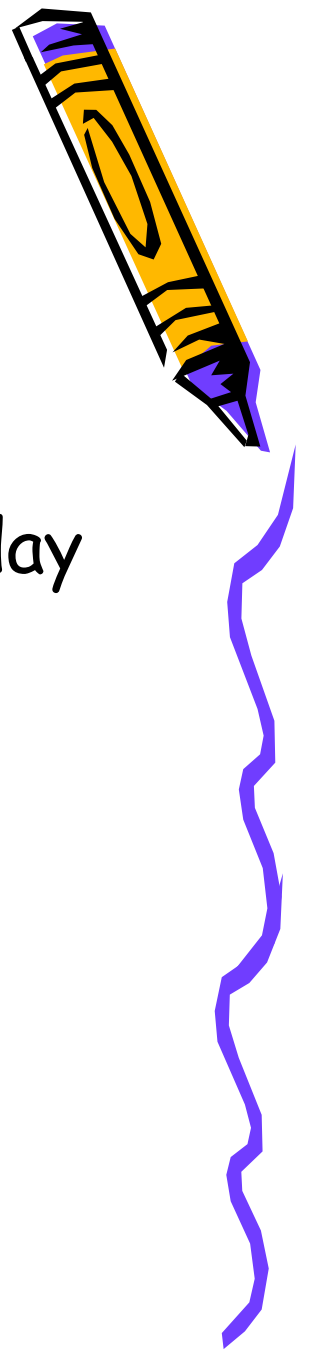
- Each child will be allocated a key worker

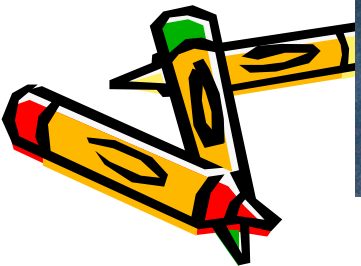
Please be aware that the start and finish times WILL be ammended to allow us to following the Government guidelines on staggering start and finish times for children. We will let you know in due course what the new times will be.



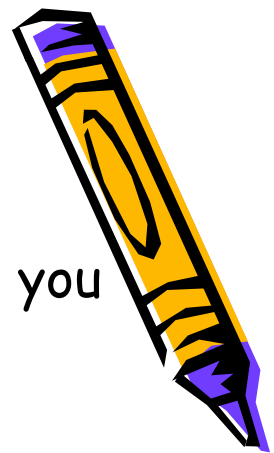
EYs Fund

- Your child might be able to get free uniform voucher if you get any of the following:
- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
